





Grammar

Plural nouns in Spanish:

- ❖ We usually add “s” at the end of the word in Spanish to make the noun a plural word:
una manzana/ dos manzanas
- ❖ **Watch out!** If the noun ends in a consonant, we need to add “es” at the end of the word to make it plural:
un melocotón / dos melocotones
- ❖ When you want to explain what items you have in your picnic, you may want to use either the phrase “**there is...**” or “**there are...**”. In Spanish we only have one phrase: “**hay...**” means both “there is ...” and “there are.....”.
En mi cesta, **hay** un bocadillo. = In my basket, **there is** a sandwich.
En mi cesta, **hay** dos manzanas. = In my basket, **there are** two apples.
