Grammar

Possessive	Singular (only one)		Plural (more than one)
my	<i>mi</i>	<i>mi</i>	<i>mis</i>
examples	mi padre (my Dad)	mi madre (my Mum)	mis abuelos (my grandparents)

❖ Adjectives in Spanish go **after** the noun:

Los ojos **verdes**
Green eyes

❖ Adjectives in Spanish **agree** with the noun they describe. That means they have a **different ending** depending on what they describe:

Un cuaderno **verde**
A green book

Los ojos **verdes**
Green eyes

'Verde' takes an **-s at the end** if it describes a **plural noun**: we have 2 eyes!
