<b>Possessive</b>		<b>Singular (only one)</b>	
<b>my</b>	<b>mi</b>	<b>mi</b>	<b>mis</b>
examples	mi padre (my Dad)	mi madre (my Mum)	mis abuelos (my grandparents)
❖ Adjectives in Spanish go <b>after</b> the noun: <b>Los ojos verdes</b> <b>Green eyes</b>			
❖ Adjectives in Spanish <b>agree</b> with the noun they describe. That means they have a <b>different ending</b> depending on what they describe: <b>Un cuaderno verde</b> A green book <b>Los ojos verdes</b> Green eyes			
'Verde' takes an <b>-s</b> <b>at the end</b> if it describes a <b>plural noun</b> : we have 2 eyes!
