During the first half of the term, we will be looking at Roald Dahl by reading, 'The Twits' and also some of his 'Revoltin' Rhymes.' We will be creating our own 'Twits' character and writing our own chapter. In Summer 2, we will be reading 'Bill's New Frock' and we will debate if we think boys should wear girls' clothes and vice versa. We will also be using our Roman topic and trip to Chester as a stimulus for our writing.



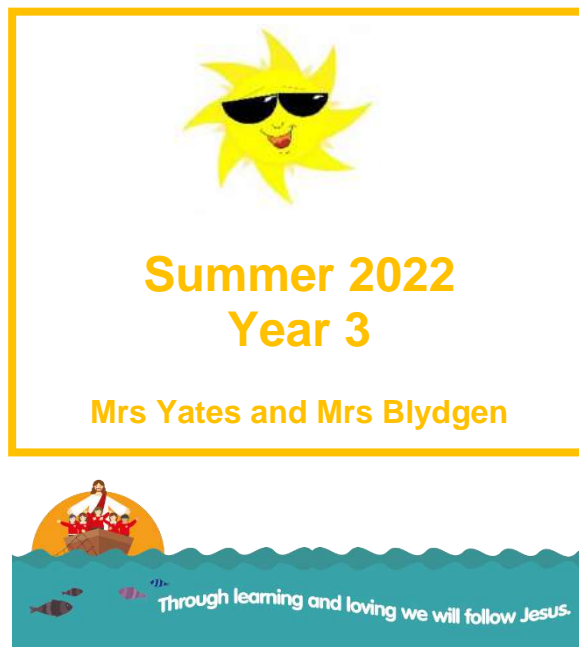
## Mathematics

This term we will be continuing our work on fractions including, finding fractions of amounts and adding & subtracting them. Then we will look at shape and investigate turns and angles. Summer 2 we measure and calculate weight & capacity where the water used will help to keep the children cool in the sunny weather (hopefully!) We will also continue to practise addition, subtraction, division and end the term with a Rockstar battle.

## Topic

This term we will be going back in time and finding out what our local area was like. We will be using the census and other historical resources to help us discover what the cotton industry was like. Why was it so important to our area? What happened to all the cotton mills? We will be using a database in our computing lessons as a way to present some of our findings.

In Summer 2, we will be revisiting our Iron Age topic and learning about how Britain changed as the Romans invaded. We will also be visiting Chester where we may meet a real Roman soldier.



## Science

In Science, we will be learning about Magnets and Forces including the work of Isaac Newton. Then later in the year, our topic will be Light.



## Religious Education

Our topics for this term will be Energy, Choices and Special Places. In the early part of the term, we will learn about how Jesus returned to his Father at the Ascension and the importance of Pentecost. Later in the year, we will learn about the Universal Church and think about special places of worship around the world. Our other faith topic will be Hinduism.

## Other

We have a very exciting term to look forward which will include our trips to Leigh Spinners Mill and Chester where we will learn more about the Romans. Towards the end of the academic year, we will be joining in with the school's Food and Music Festival where we will be investigating and making sandwiches using local produce to share with others at the festival.
