There are two words for “**a**” in Spanish.
These words are “**un**” and “**una**”.

Grammar

In Spanish we add an ‘**s**’ at the end of the nouns to form the plural: **gatos**, **perros**, **caballos**.
Watch out for the exceptions : **peces**, **ratones**

Grammar

In Spanish, when we use adjectives of colour to describe an animal, the colour comes after the animal:
a black dog = un perro negro
a white cat = un gato blanco

Fact Bank

In different languages animals make different noises. In Spanish the noise a dog makes is “**guau**”.
