Nouns Bank

Singular:

la cabeza – the head
el hombro – the shoulder
la rodilla - the knee
el pie – the foot
la pierna the leg
el brazo – the arm
la mano – the hand
el cuerpo – the body

un ojo – one eye

Plural:

los hombros – the shoulders
las rodillas - the knees
los pies - the feet
las piernas - the legs
los brazos - the arms

Command Bank (verbs)

mueve - Move
relaja – relax
tócate - Touch

levanta – Lift
dobla – Bend
respira - Breathe
Quédate quieto – Stand still
gira – Turn
estira – Stretch

Phonics

“**hom**” (**hombros**)
“**llas**” (**rodillas**)
“**ie**” (**pie, pierna**)
“**gi**” (**gira**)

Fact Bank

In Spanish, the song “Head, shoulders, knees and toes” is called “Head, shoulders, knees and feet”.

Grammar

There are **2 ways** to translate the plural determiner “the” in Spanish: “**los**” and “**las**”. We use “los” for masculine nouns and “las” for feminine nouns:

El brazo → los brazos (the arm → the arms)
La mano → las manos (the hand → the hands)

Grammar

We say and write colours as adjectives after the noun in Spanish, for example: “**el ojo rojo**”, “**la pierna verde**”.

When we say and write colours as adjectives after the noun in Spanish, the spelling may change to match the noun, for example: “**el ojo amarillo**”, “**la pierna amarilla**”.
