




What happens if my child has to self-isolate?



As the last term has shown us, home learning is going to be essential in minimising the disruption to our children's education and ensuring the children catch up and keep up. Like the majority of schools in the borough, year groups have been sent home to isolate or have had to isolate due to family members having symptoms or testing positive. In these cases, where children are well they should be reminded that this is not a holiday and that they are required to complete the work provided by their class teacher whilst they are isolating. Unfortunately, the work set remotely cannot be repeated when the children return to school. If your child is unwell and unable to complete the work please contact school. Below is a brief summary of our remote home learning procedures

The work that needs to be completed will be set via Class Dojo portfolio or Purple Mash for Years 2-6 and Tapestry for Reception and Year 1. The teacher will mark the work electronically and provide feedback to the children on the work that they submit. The work may be added to their portfolio or sent back to the children to add more detail.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"></p> <p>The class teacher will set work for the children on a daily basis. The work set will mirror the work completed in school. Class teachers will provide explanations for new concepts using live and pre-recorded videos clips and powerpoints. The work that needs to be completed will be set via Class Dojo portfolio or Purple Mash for Years 2-6 and Tapestry for Reception and Year 1. The teacher will mark the work electronically and provide feedback to the children on the work that they submit. The work may be added to their portfolio or sent back to the children to add more detail.</p>
